Beijing, China, 12-13 July 2023

# Forging the right partnerships for climate-resilient infrastructure development in Asia and the Pacific

Infrastructure financing and climate change stand as the most pressing issues facing Asia and the Pacific today. Given extreme weather, climate-resilient infrastructure investment is crucial to sustainable development and significantly impacts society. Record heatwaves swept across Bangkok this summer, where ESCAP is headquartered, with temperatures regularly exceeding 40 degrees Celsius across mainland South East Asia, including Myanmar, Lao PDR, and Cambodia. This heatwave, cited as the worst April heatwave in Asian history across more than a dozen countries, highlights the region is facing unprecedented temperature changes as global warming accelerates.

In commemoration of World Pride Month in June, our blog highlights the enduring reality of persistent inequalities that continue to shape the lives of marginalized communities worldwide. Gender equality, in particular, remains a resounding challenge, casting its shadow over the realm of infrastructure development. Globally, women's representation in leadership positions across all infrastructure sectors remains low, with only <u>19 percent</u> of such positions being held by women. While sustainable infrastructure projects hold great promise for fostering economic growth and improving the well-being of people in Asia and the Pacific, true progress requires the integration of gender considerations into every aspect of planning and implementation.
